The Lord's Table is <u>WHERE WE PRACTICE PRESENCE</u>

THROUGH MUTUAL SUBMISSION, RECONCILIATION, AND

DISCERNMENT

"Faithful presence names the reality that God is present in the world and that he uses a people faithful to his presence to make himself concrete and real amid the world's struggles and pain." - David Fitch

I. John 13:21-38

²¹ After he had said this, Jesus was troubled in spirit and testified, "Very truly I tell you, one of you is going to betray me."... ³⁴ "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

In the Church, the Lord's Table SHOULD REPRESENT THE

FULLNESS OF AUTHENTIC RELATIONSHIP

Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. ³ Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. Ephesians 4:2-3

II. Mark 6:30-34

³² So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place.
³³ But many who saw them leaving recognized them and ran on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them.
³⁴ When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began teaching them many things.

In the Neighborhood, the Lord's Table <u>INVITES NEIGHBORS</u>

TO EXPERIENCE FAITHFUL PRESENCE WITH US

Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." 38 This is the first and greatest commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' Matthew 22:37-39

III. Luke 10:1-11

³ Go! I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. ⁴ Do not take a purse or bag or sandals; and do not greet anyone on the road. ⁵ "When you enter a house, first say, 'Peace to this house.' ⁶ If someone who promotes peace is there, your peace will rest on them; if not, it will return to you. ⁷ Stay there, eating and drinking whatever they give you, for the worker deserves his wages. Do not move around from house to house. ⁸ "When you enter a town and are welcomed, eat what is offered to you.

In the World, the Lord's Table <u>IS DISPLAYED WHEN WE</u> VULNERABLY RECEIVE THE HOSPITALITY OF OUTSIDERS
