

# 3. "In the Belly of the Fish" The Vineyard Church of Conroe Raymond McDonald August 13, 2017

#### **Sermon Notes**

Then some of the Pharisees and teachers of the law said to him, "Teacher, we want to see a sign from you." <sup>39</sup> He answered, "A wicked and adulterous generation asks for a sign! But none will be given it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. <sup>40</sup> For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of a huge fish, so the Son of Man will be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. Matthew 12:38-40

### The Belly of the Fish is <u>A PLACE OF CONFINEMENT AND</u> DARKNESS

### But WHERE WE ARE SAVED FROM DROWNING AND OUR CALL IS RESTORED

Now the Lord provided a huge fish to swallow Jonah, and Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights. Jonah 1:17

#### I. Jonah 2:1-2

<sup>2:1</sup> From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the Lord his God. <sup>2</sup>He said: "In my distress I called to the Lord, and he answered me. From deep in the realm of the dead I called for help, and you listened to my cry.

### In the Belly of the Fish <u>OUR DISTRESS CAUSES US TO SEEK</u> <u>GOD</u>

We boast in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance;<sup>4</sup> perseverance, character; and character, hope. <sup>5</sup> And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us. Romans 5:2b-5

#### II. Jonah 2:3-6

<sup>3</sup> You hurled me into the depths, into the very heart of the seas, and the currents swirled about me; all your waves and breakers swept over me. <sup>4</sup> I said, 'I have been banished from your sight; yet I will look again toward your holy temple.' <sup>5</sup> The engulfing waters threatened me, the deep surrounded me; seaweed was wrapped around my head. <sup>6</sup> To the roots of the mountains I sank down; the earth beneath barred me in forever. But you, Lord my God, brought my life up from the pit.

## In the Belly of the Fish <u>WE FEEL RESTRAINED AND</u> <u>OVERWHELMED SO WE REST AND REMEMBER GOD'S</u> <u>GOODNESS</u>

Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. <sup>17</sup> For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. <sup>18</sup> So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. 2 Corinthians 4:17-18

#### III. Jonah 2:7-10

<sup>7</sup> "When my life was ebbing away, I remembered you, Lord, and my prayer rose to you, to your holy temple. <sup>8</sup> "Those who cling to worthless idols turn away from God's love for them. <sup>9</sup> But I, with shouts of grateful praise, will sacrifice to you. What I have vowed I will make good. I will say, 'Salvation comes from the Lord.'" <sup>10</sup> And the Lord commanded the fish, and it vomited Jonah onto dry land.

### In the Belly of the Fish <u>IN RUINATION WE FIND THE</u> RESTORATION OF OUR CALL

Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. <sup>25</sup> Anyone who loves their life will lose it, while anyone who hates their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. John 12:24-25
